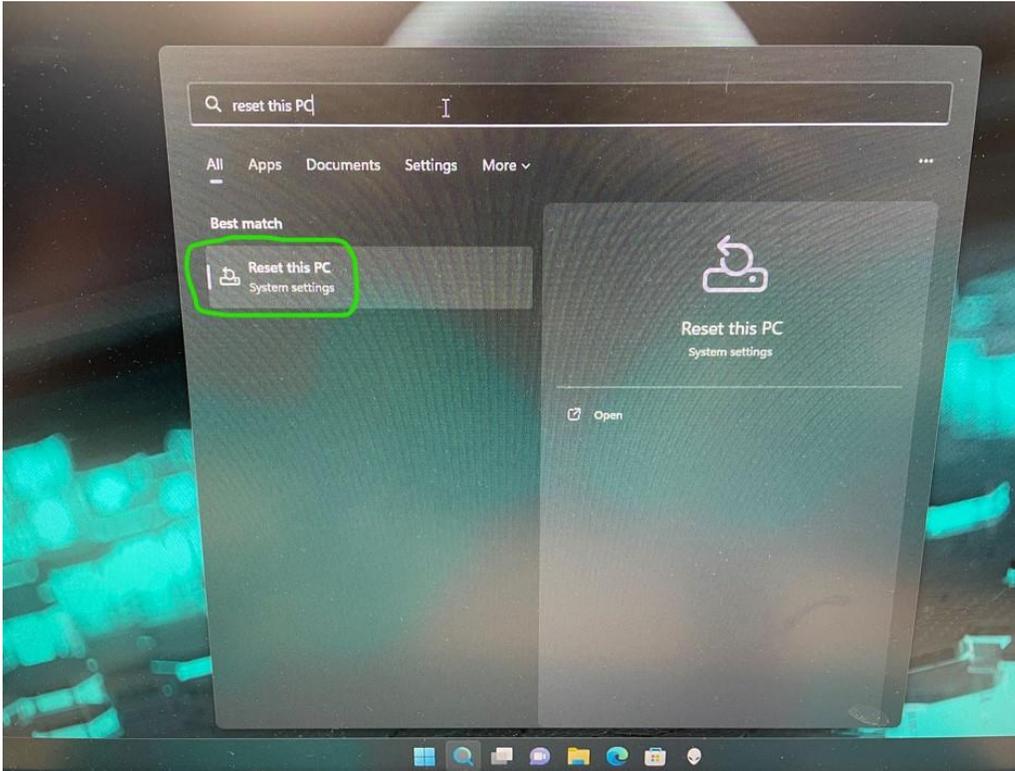
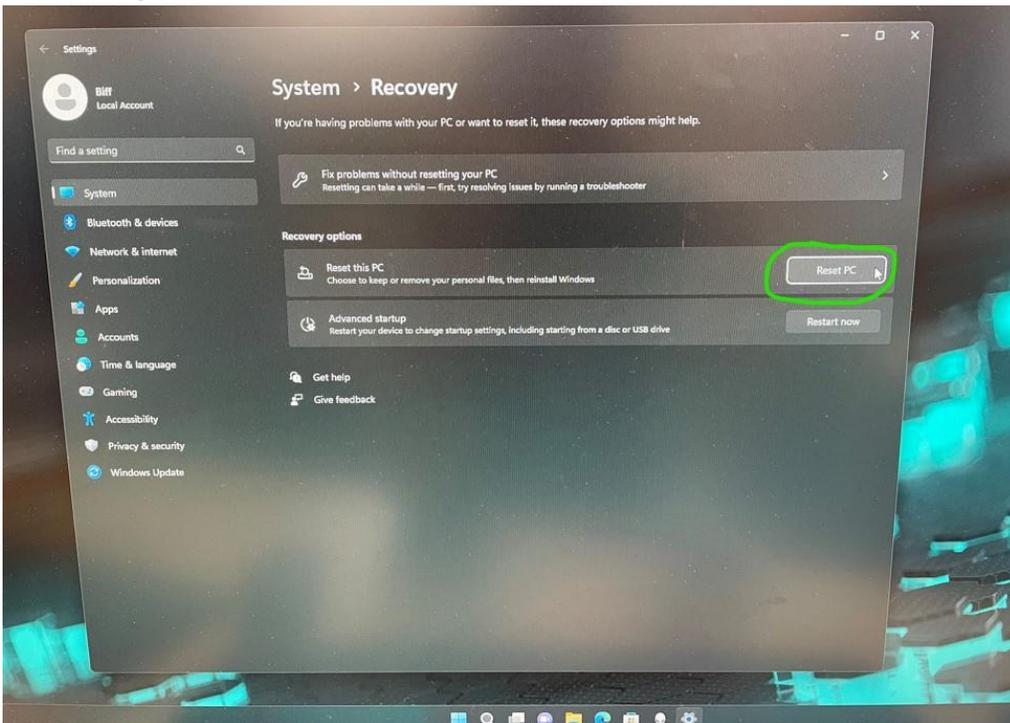


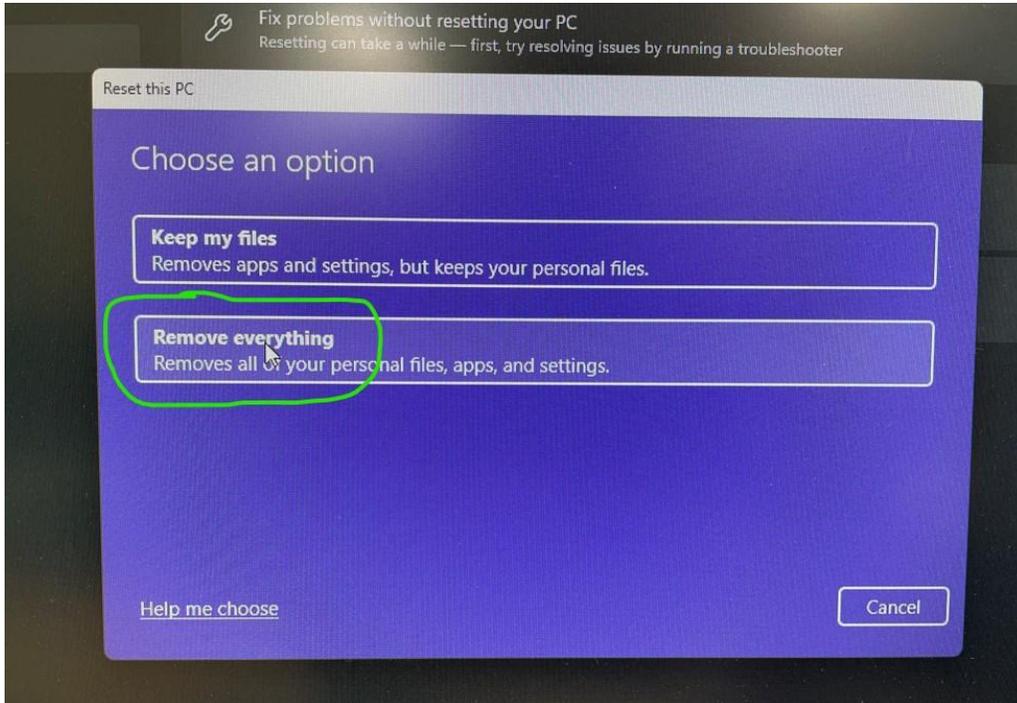
1. Backup any important data to USB flash drive
2. In the Windows search, type in **“Reset”**, should get the option to Reset this PC



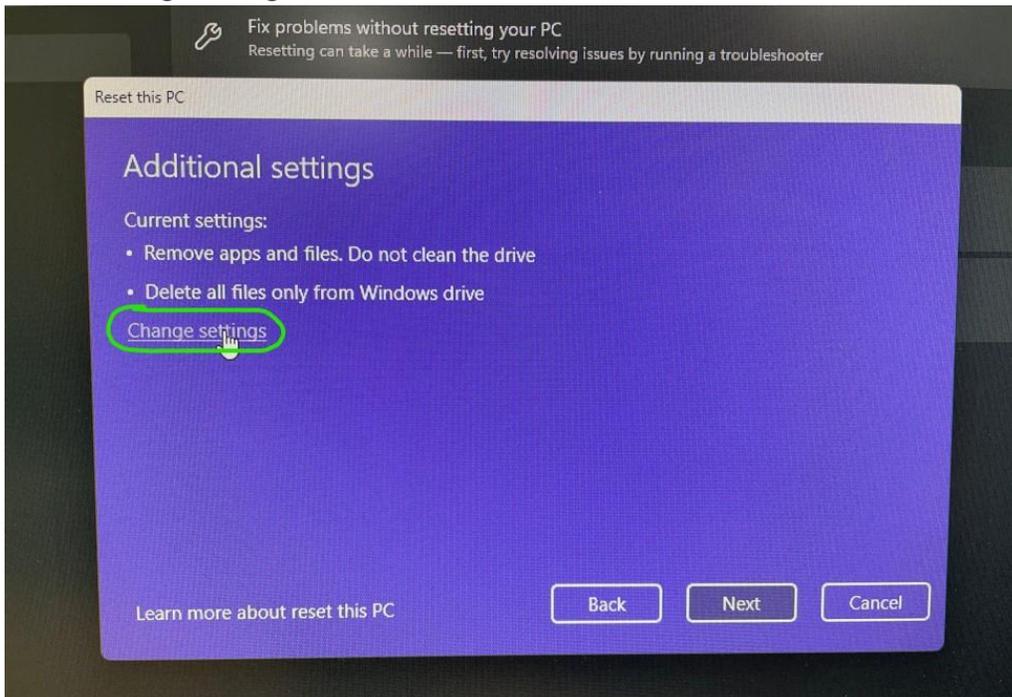
3. You'll then get this screen, click the **“Reset PC”** button



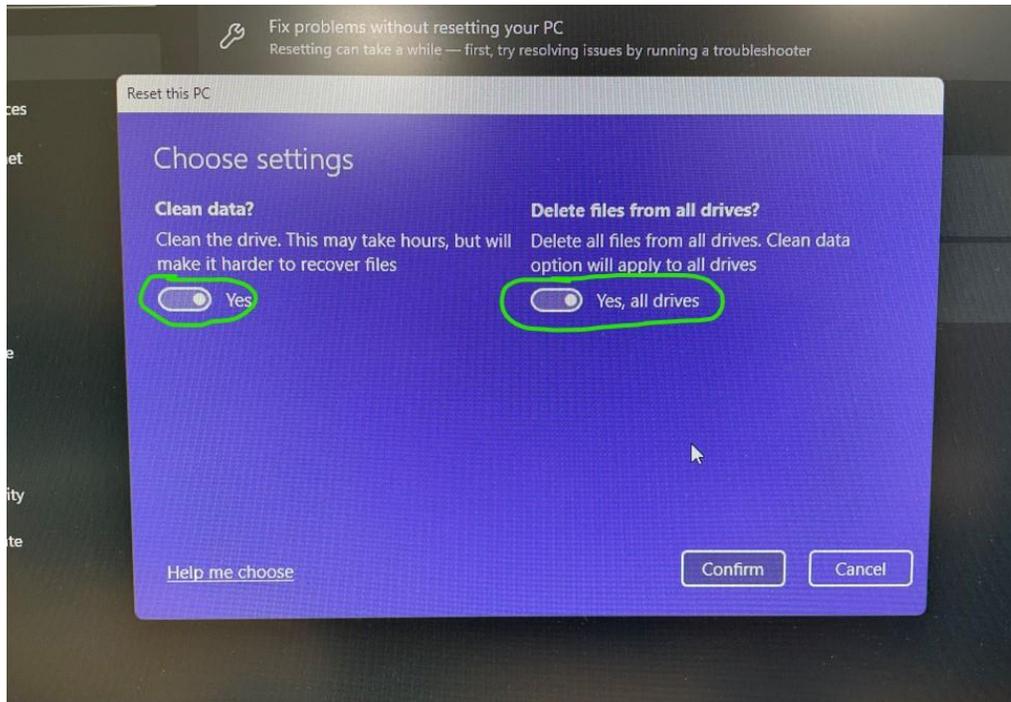
#### 4. Choose “Remove Everything”



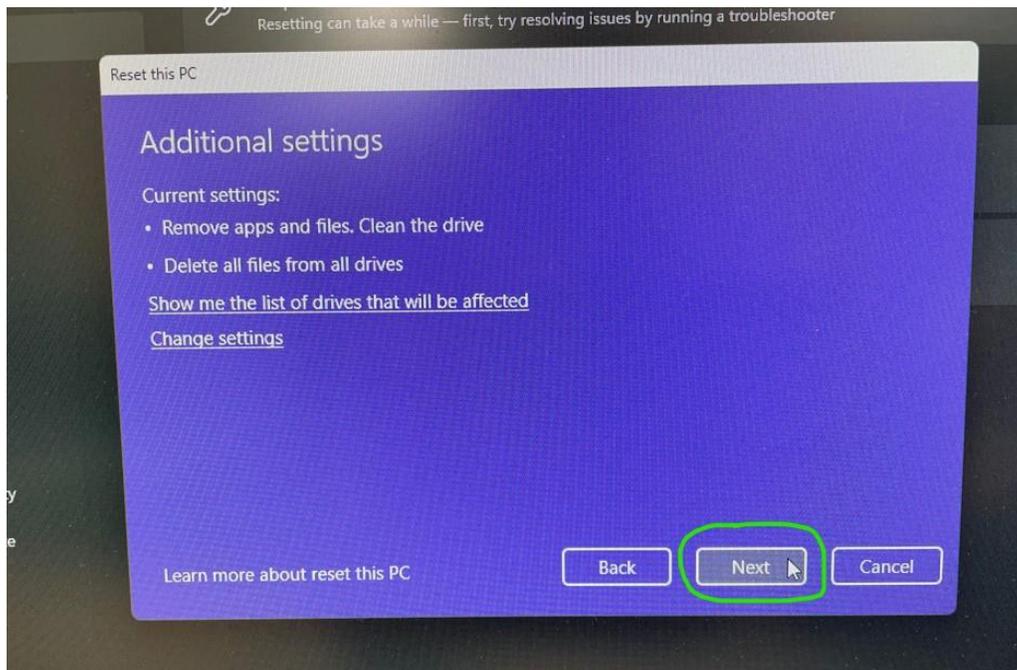
#### 5. Pick “Change Settings”



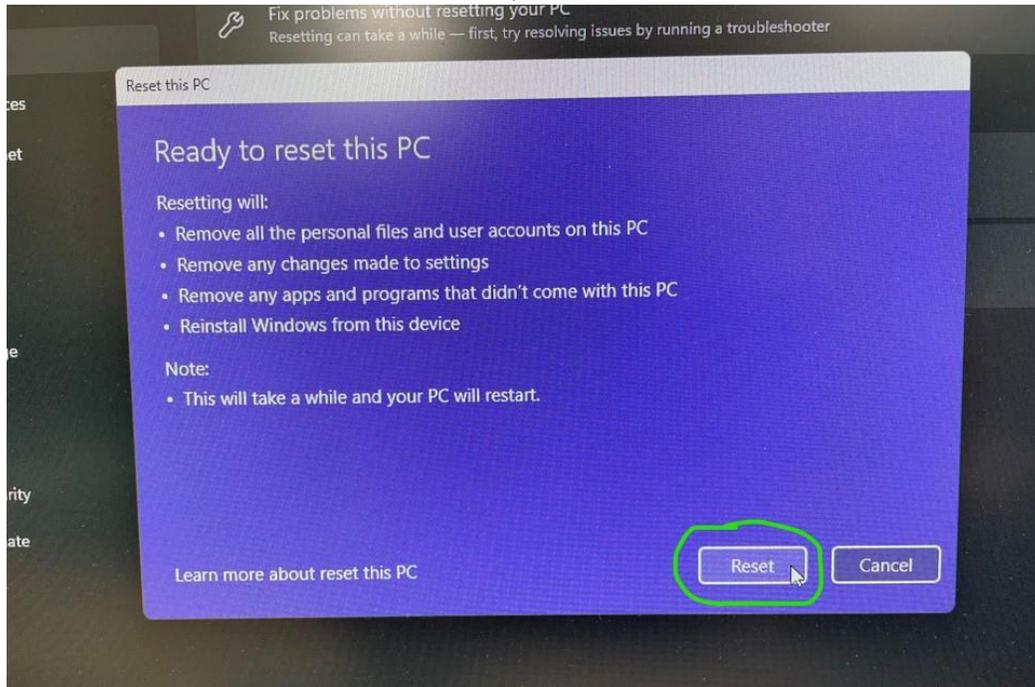
6. Set **Clean Data** to **Yes**, and **Delete files from all drives** to **Yes**. Hit **Confirm**



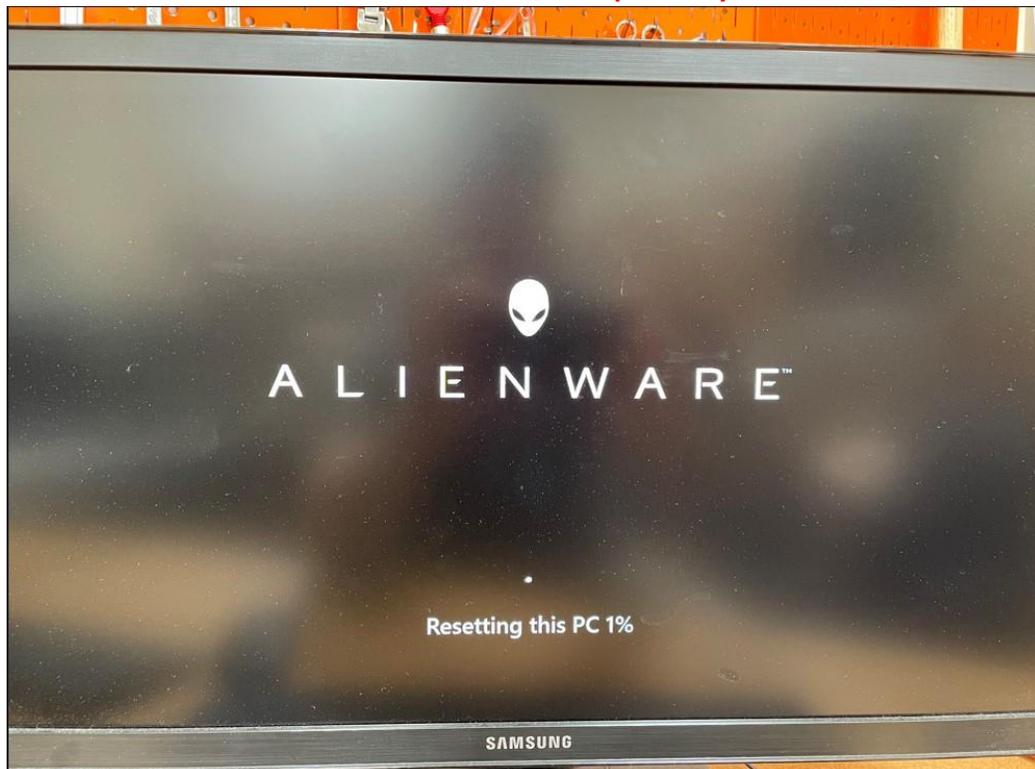
7. Now hit **Next**



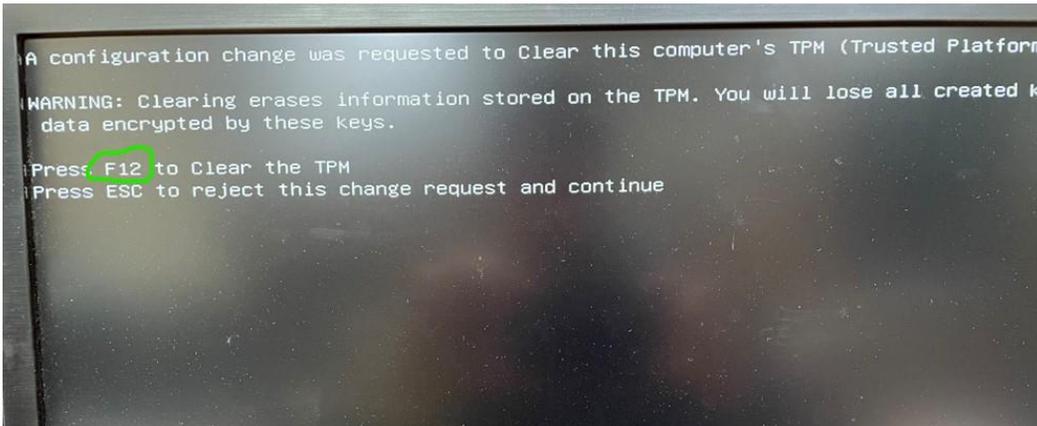
8. Hit the Reset button and it will start the process



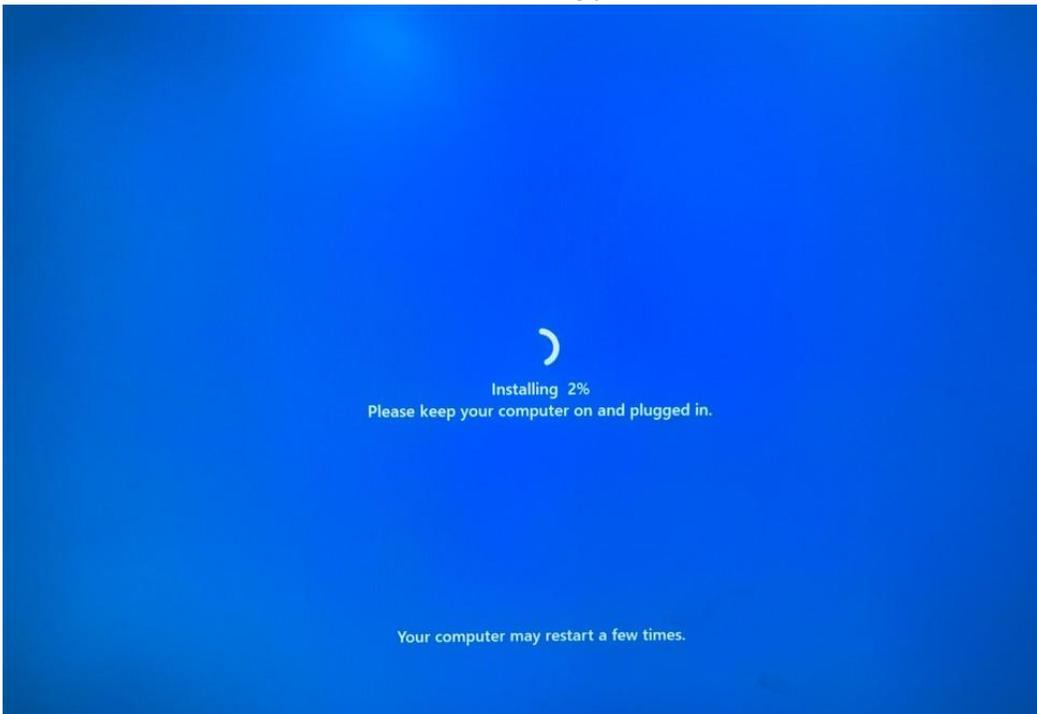

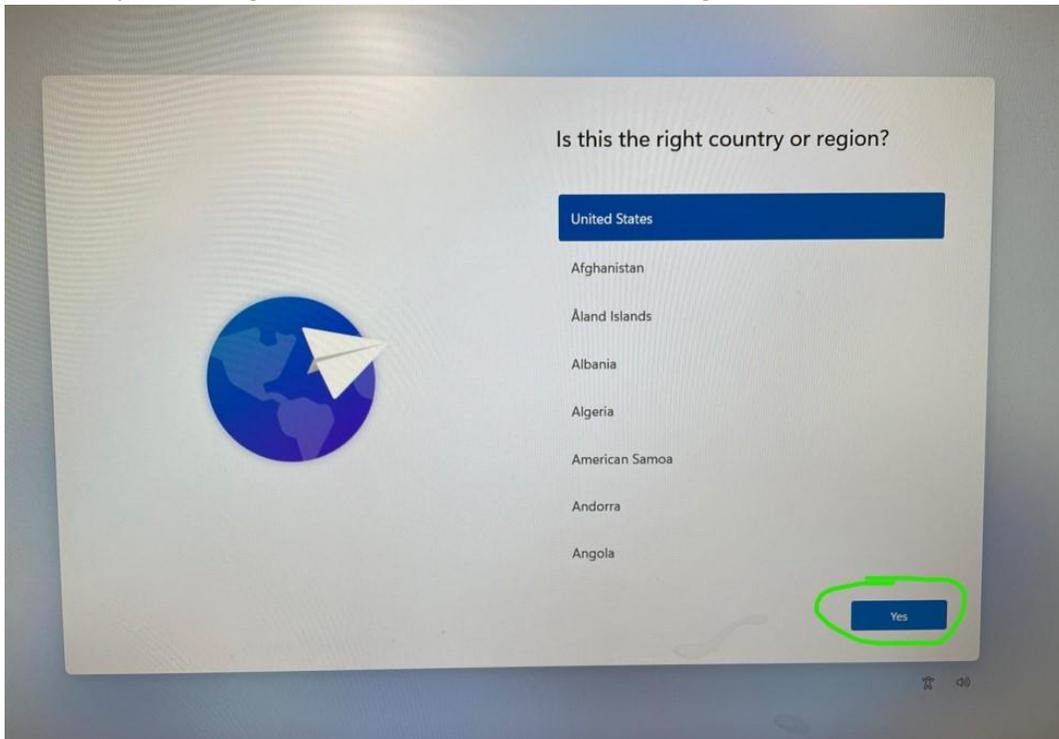
10. During the reset process, you **MIGHT** get this screen asking to Clear the TPM. This is fine, just press F12 to clear this. If F12 does nothing, you need to hold the **Function** key + F12



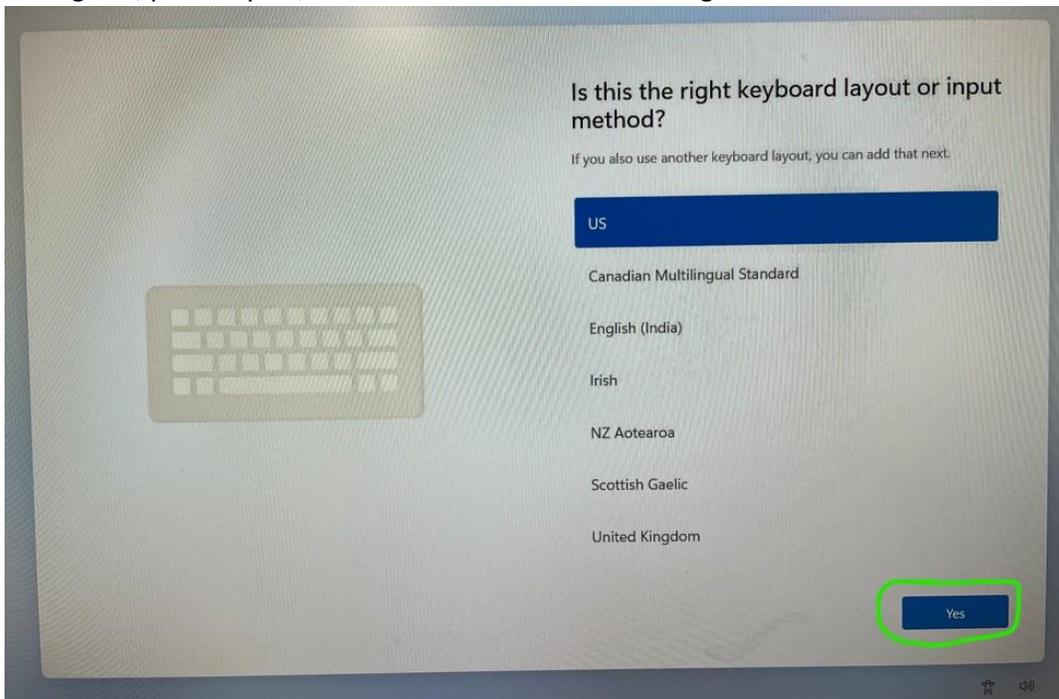
11. After that, it will continue with the remaining part of the reset.



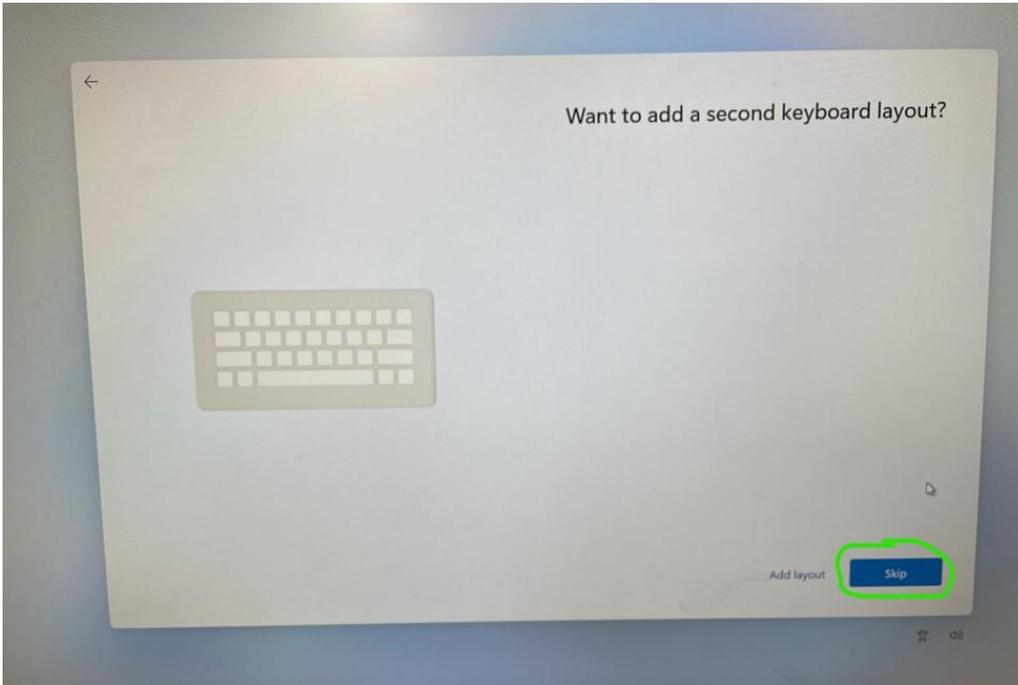
12. Now pick the Region, but we'll be back to this screen again in a moment. You'll see why



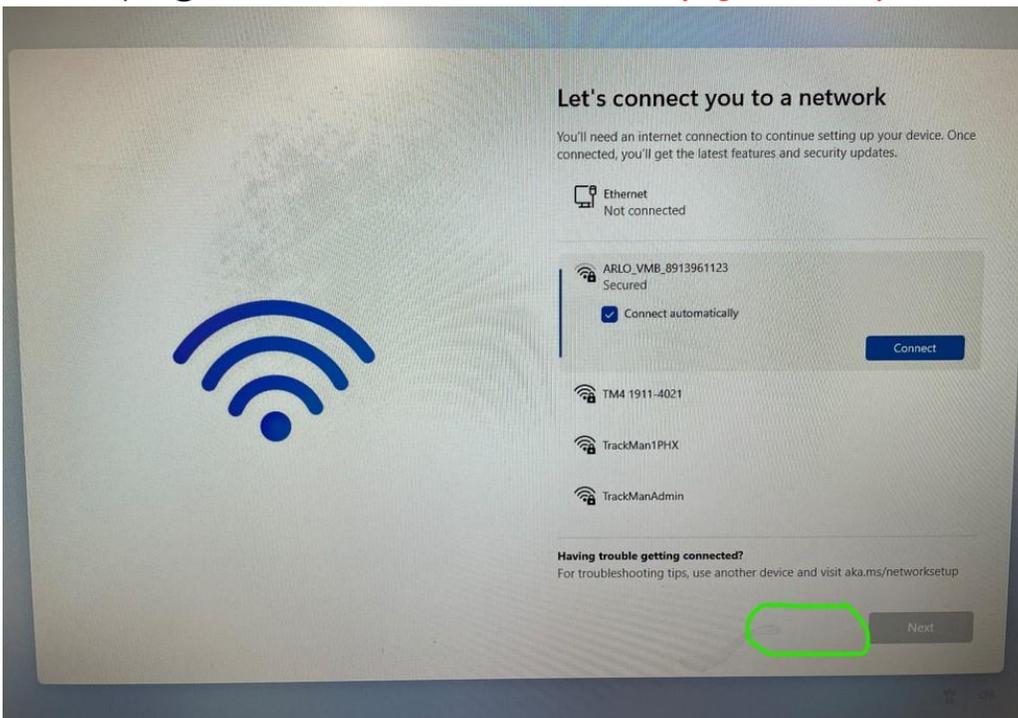
13. Againn, pick a layout, but we'll be back to this screen again soon.



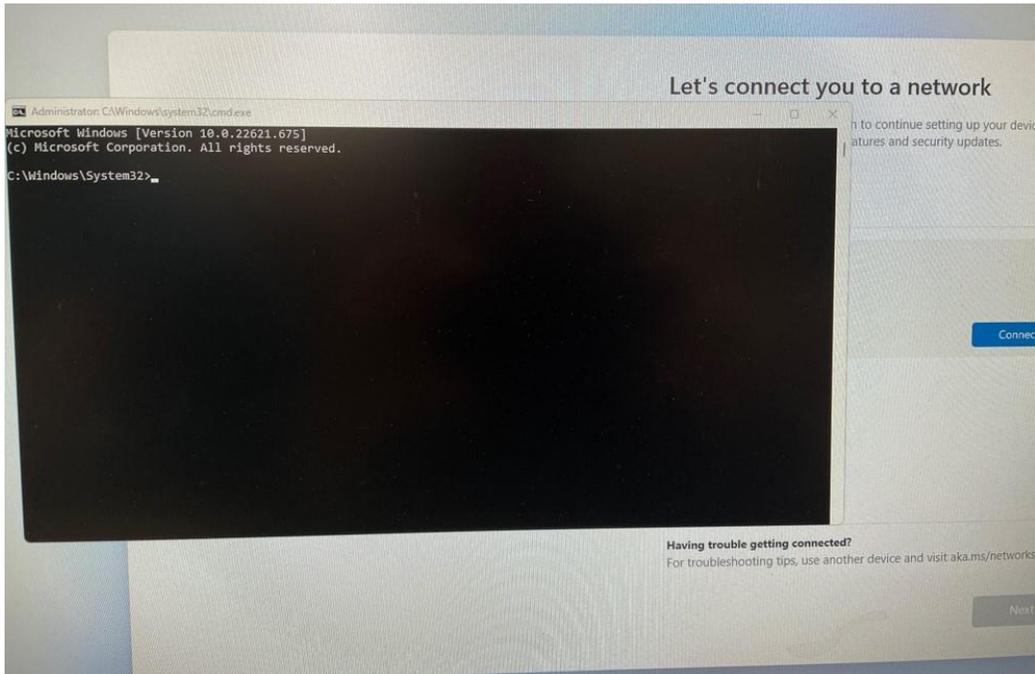
14. Just hit Skip here, we'll be back soon



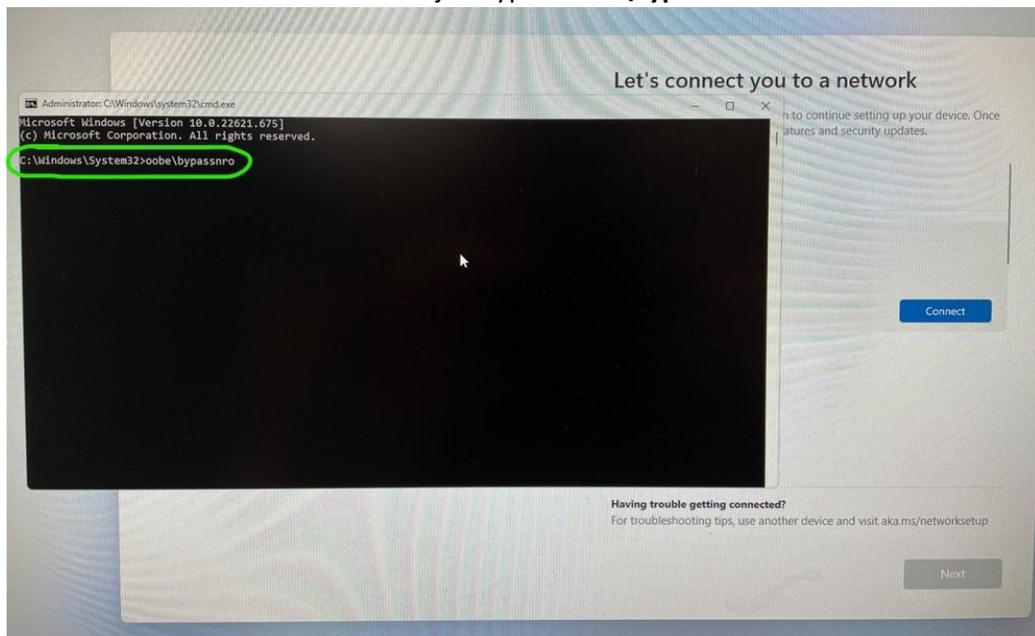
15. **Ok, here's the important screen.** If you connect to the internet via Ethernet cable, we had already unhooked that cord, but if you connect to the internet via wireless, you **DO NOT** want to connect to that right now. You'll cause login problems into Win11 if you connect to your internet right now. Just choose the option at the bottom that says "I don't have internet" ....EXCEPT.... it's not there yet 😊. It will be. **Just don't connect wirelessly right now and proceed to step 16**



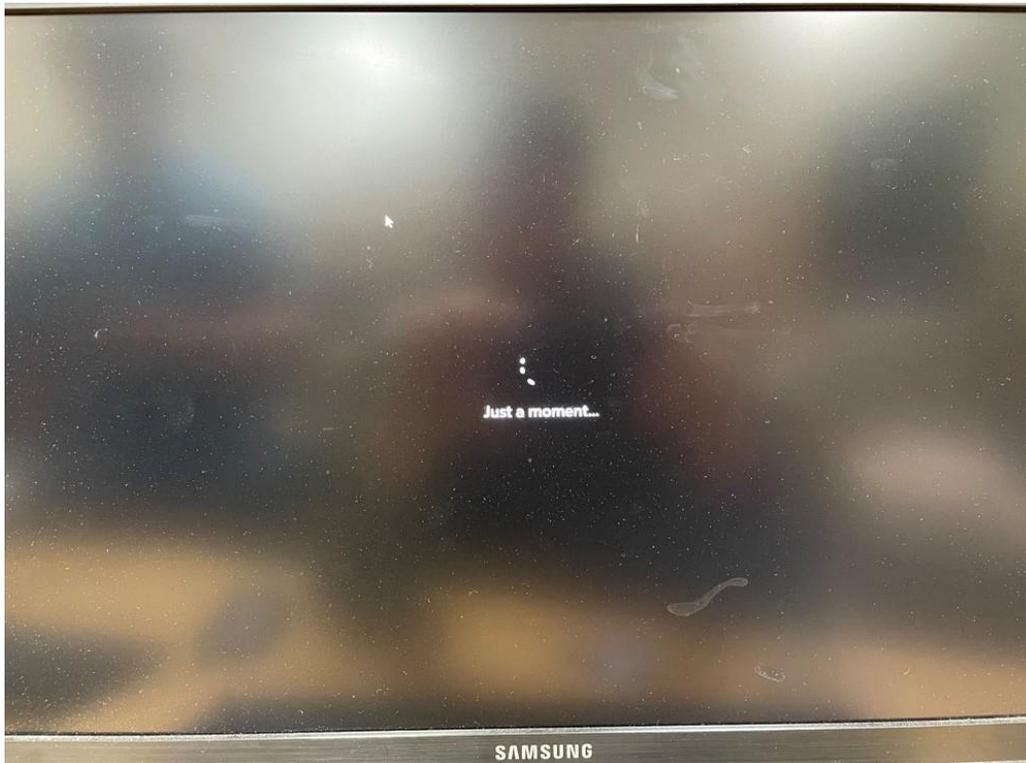
16. On this same wireless screen, just press **SHIFT + F10** (or **Function+Shift+F10**) and this black box will pop up.



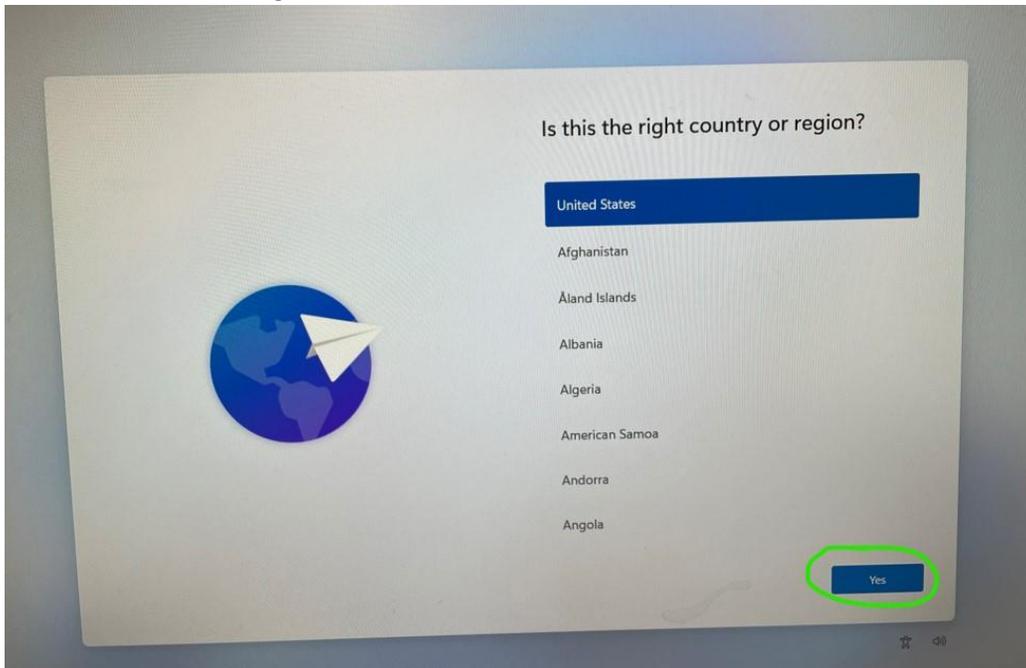
17. Click into the black window and just type **oobe\bypassnro** then Enter



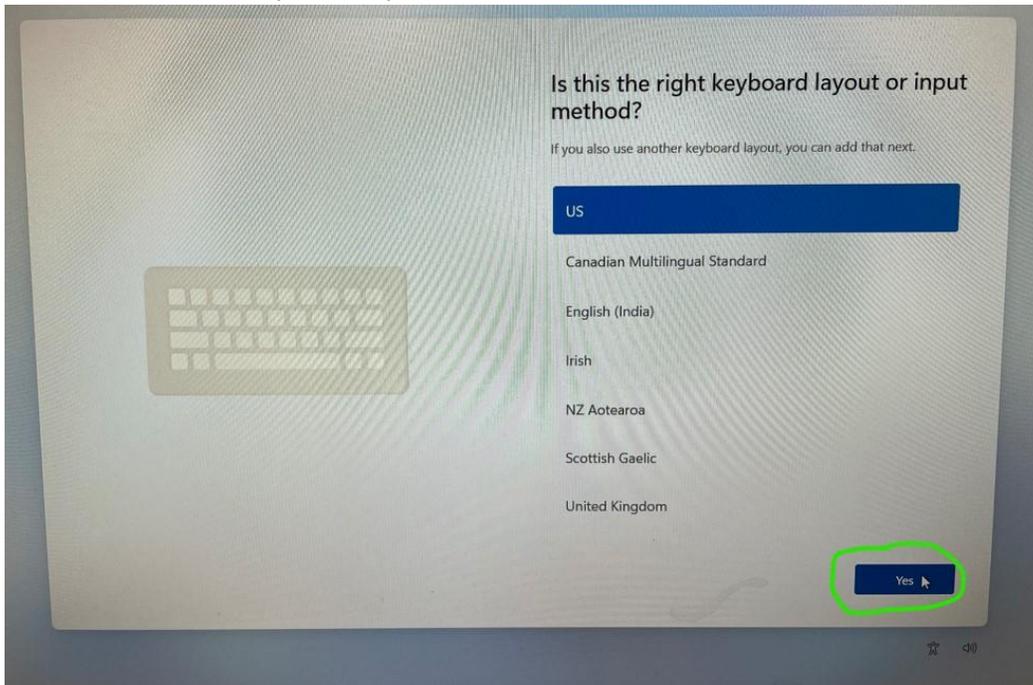
18. Windows 11 will now do a little reboot



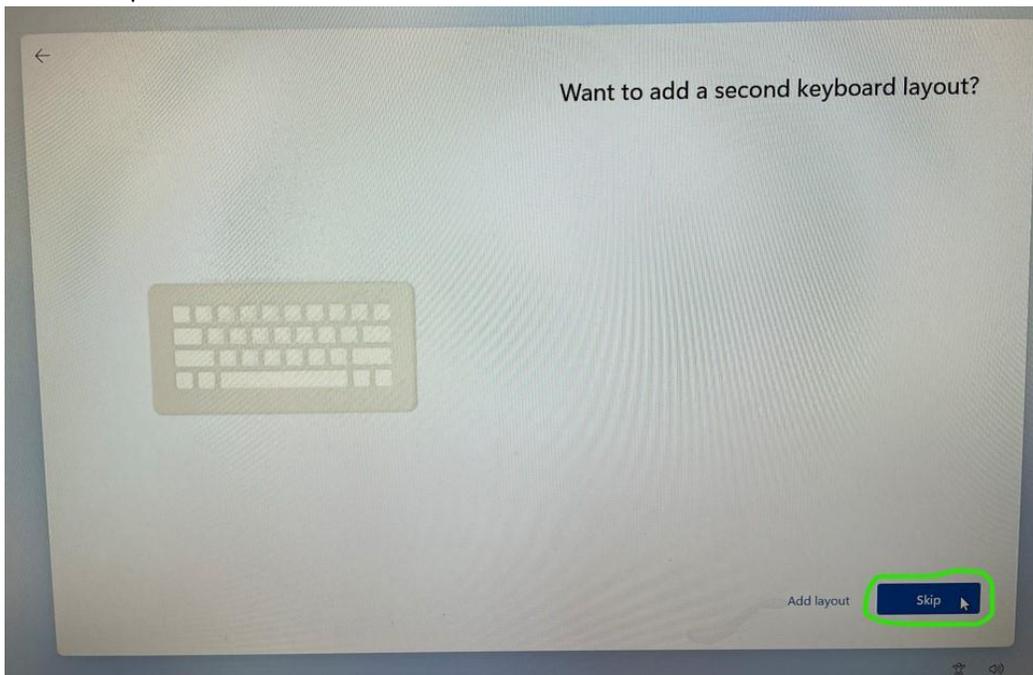
19. Here is the final region screen



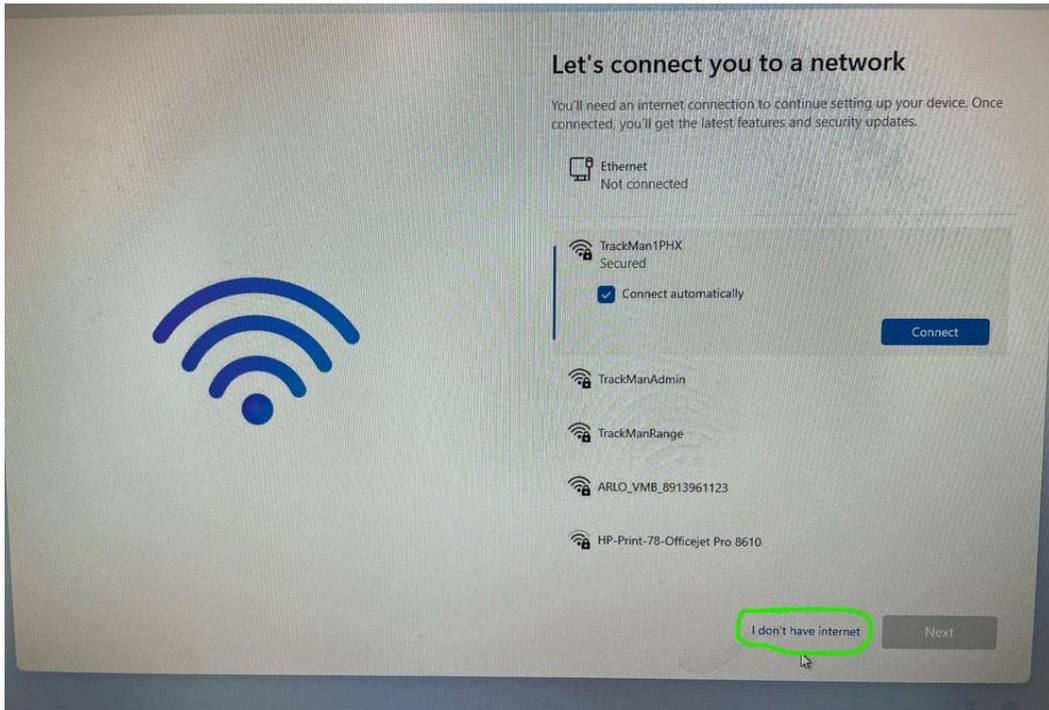
20. Here is the final keyboard layout choice



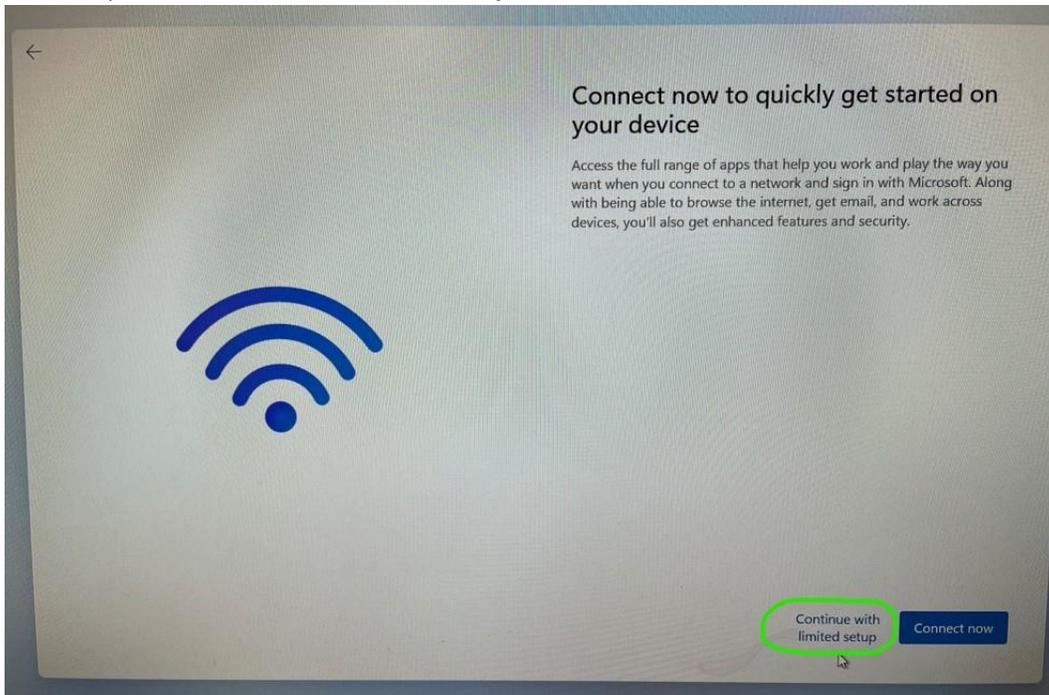
21. Hit Skip on this



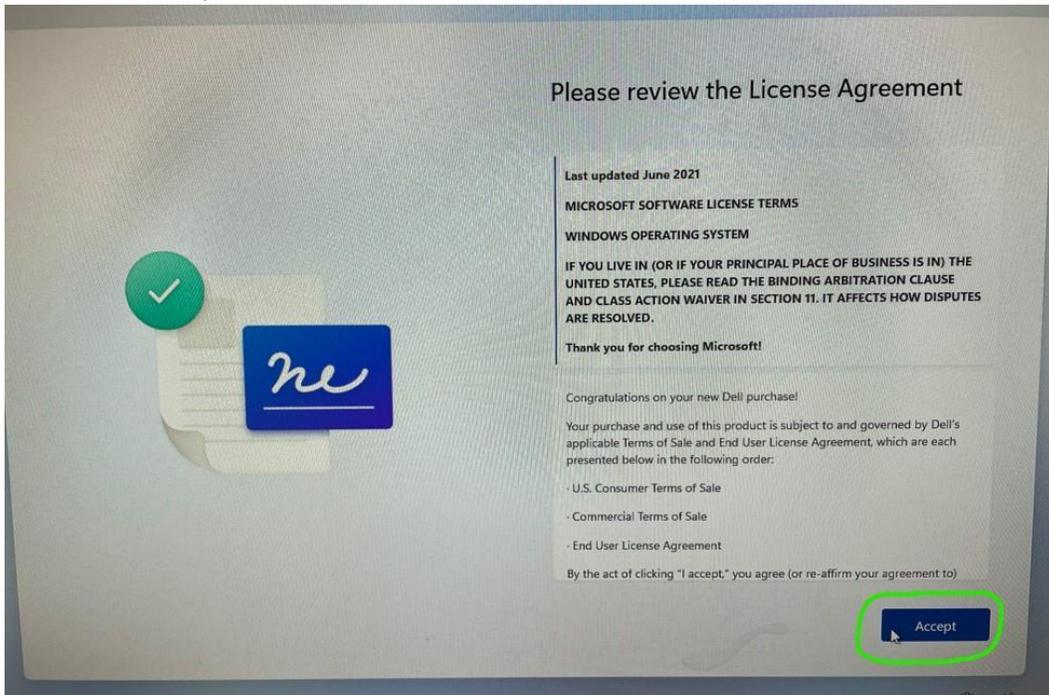

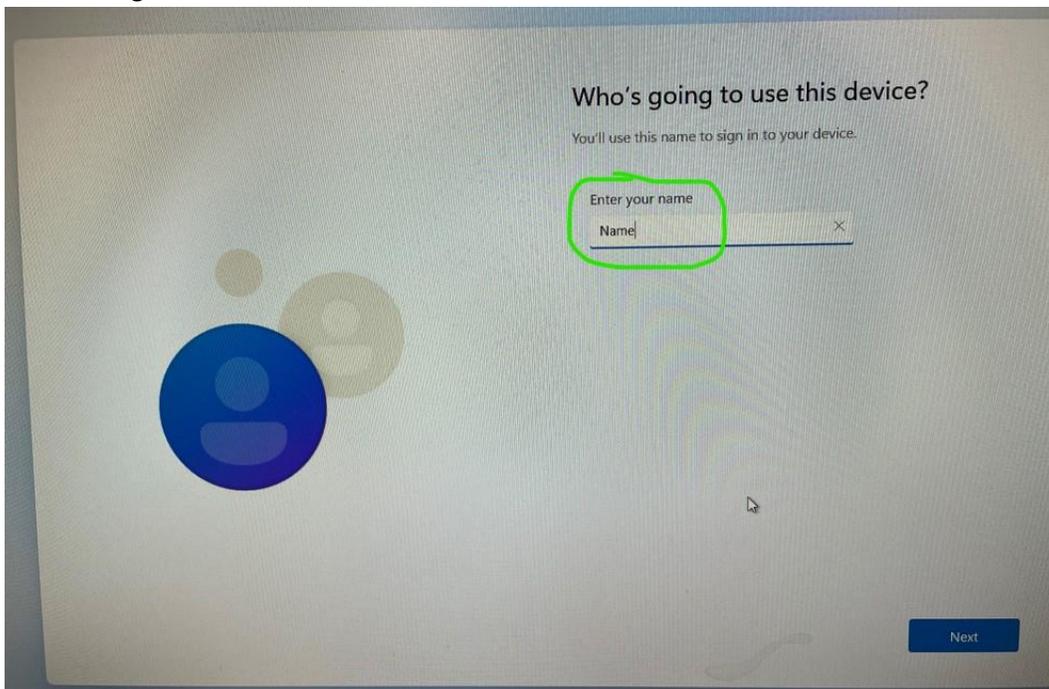
23. Just pick "Continue with limited setup"



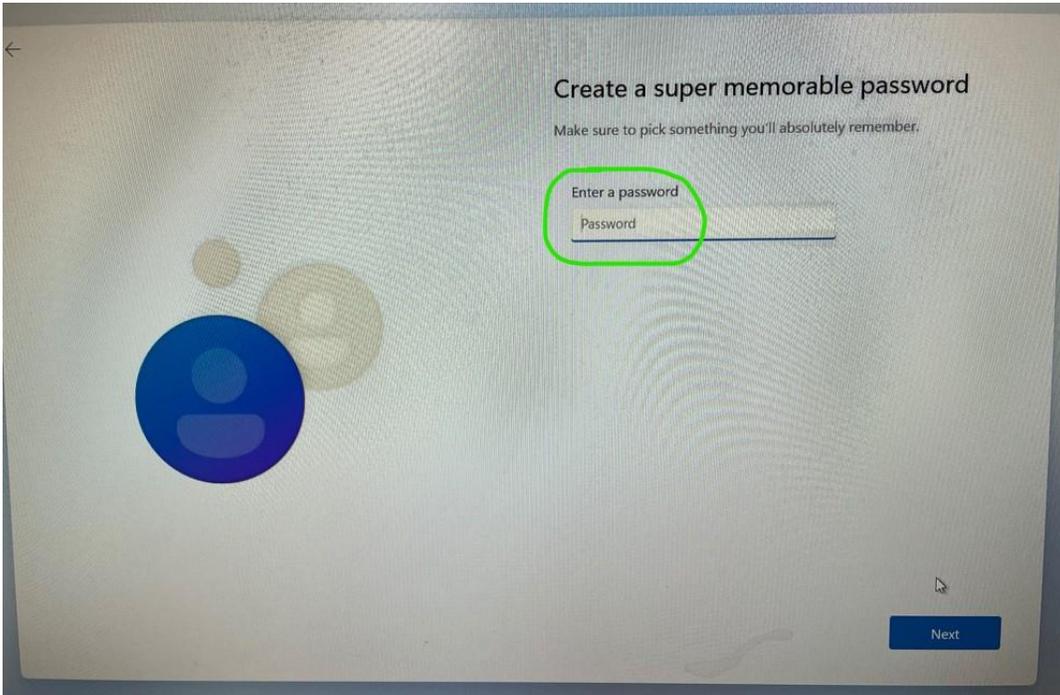
24. Just hit Accept



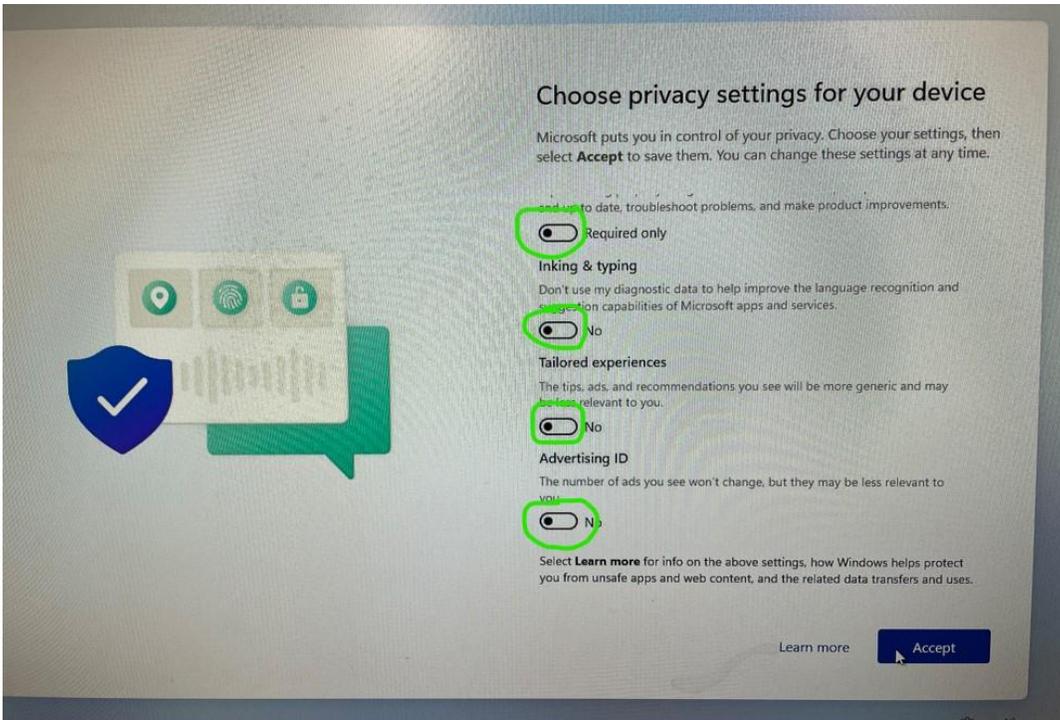
